Rectangular VAV terminal units for variable and constant air volume systems, for demanding acoustic requirements, suitable for extract air, available in 5 nominal sizes. High control accuracy even in case of unfavourable upstream conditions. Ready-to-commission unit which consists of the mechanical parts and the electronic control components. Each unit contains an averaging effective pressure sensor for volume flow rate measurement, a damper blade, and an integral sound attenuator. Factory-assembled control components complete with wiring and tubing. Effective pressure sensor with 3 mm measuring holes, hence resistant to contamination. Both ends suitable for the connection of ducts. Casing with acoustic and thermal insulation. Position of the damper blade indicated externally at shaft extension. The damper blade is factory set to open position, which allows a ventilation airflow even without control; this does not apply to variants with defined safe position NC (normally closed). 

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. The data represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. 
